# The Royal Charter



772 years ago in 1253 King Henry III signed a series of charters granting permission for annual fairs to be held in many towns and villages throughout the land.

Chulmleigh was one such place and is now one of the very few to uphold their charter to the present day. The fair has survived through the centuries, two world wars and COVID. A transcribed copy of the original Charter can be seen in Chulmleigh Town Hall.

Our fair is linked to the Feast of Mary Magdalene and therefore commences the Tuesday following the feast day which is the 22nd July each year. Mary Magdalene is also the patron saint of our Parish Church.

This year, Chulmleigh Old Fair starts on Tuesday 22nd July with the reading of the Charter by our Town Crier Ben Farlam and runs until July 26th.

### The White Glove

Legend has it that King Henry sent his own gauntlet to Chulmleigh to be displayed during the Fair.

This would have been to show that Royal permission had been granted for the Fair to take place and would therefore offer protection from marauding 'king's men'.



Our large model of the glove (made by Debbie Phillips) reflects the importance of the old tradition. It is carried by the Chief Herald during the opening procession and is then displayed outside the Town Hall for the duration of the Fair.



### Memories

#### Or why I fell in love with Chulmleigh Old Fair.

We moved to Chulmleigh some 44 years ago and 'The Fair' soon became a must for us and our young family. Shortly after arriving we were all at the Swimming Gala.

Some may now ask how did you have such an event when there is no Swimming pool in Chulmleigh. However we did have a swimming pool at the Community College built by the Staff, senior boys of the College and local residents. The pool was built in response to a tragic accident in 1959 when a young local girl drowned in the Little Dart River below Chulmleigh. It opened in 1962 and later become the venue for our Gala.

However back to when we were attending one of our first Swimming Galas. The organiser approached me and said 'I believe you are involved in Gymnastics, would you help judge the diving competition'. I was not sure why being a Gymnastics Coach qualified me to judge diving but happily agreed. The deep end of the pool was 5ft which was less than the height of some of the competitors resulting in a few grazed heads.

However I will have the enduring memory of a queue of dripping, shivering young people awaiting their turn to perform, none were quite up to the Tom Daley standard but their enthusiasm was.

Sadly the last Gala was in 2001 before the pool was closed down and filled in, due to maintenance, repair costs etc.

This started the families love of the 'Fair' and we never missed one. Even now most of our family with their own offspring return every year (like many others). It has been a privilege to be part of the team that makes this possible.
